C-01 CONCEPT DRAWINGS

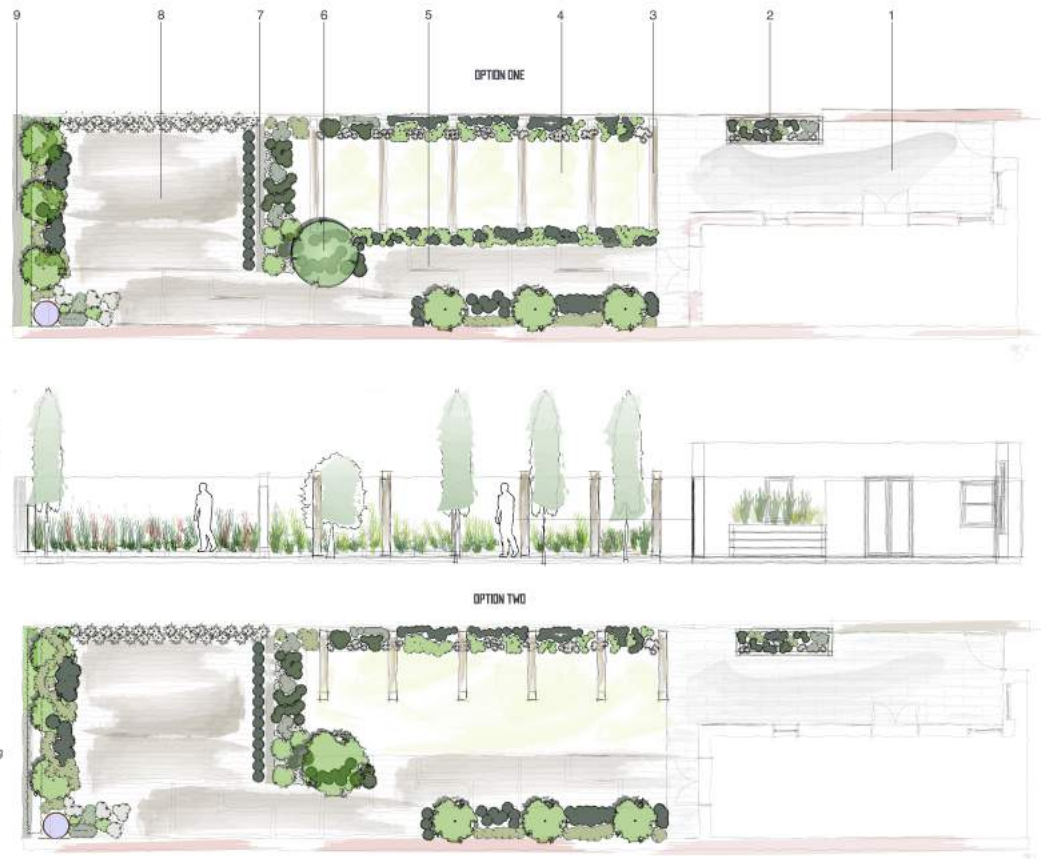
Key:

- 1: New grey paving, smooth finish and fitted with a 2.5mm joint, pointed with a contrasting jointing material. Slab to be the largest size available to make this area appear larger than it is.
- 2: Raised planed oak planter set with a small slate boundary. The boundary is tannins etc leaping from oak do not leave stains on the new paved area. This planter is to contain herbs for the kitchen.
- 3: Full width pergola of grass area.
- 4: Synthetic grass area.
- 5: Composite decking fitted in a jigsaw style pattern. The gaps between each block to be fitted with L.E.D strip lighting. Each segment to "float" above ground level. All fixings to be invisible.
- 6: Existing tree retained.
- 7: New wall to split the two sections of the garden. Finished with a "monocouche" render. The wall will also feature cut outs to show the space behind. The side facing the private area is to be used as "screen" for a projector.
- 8: New rear private deck area.
- 9: New rear boundary wall, sections clad with recessed Norstone Rockpanel or similar to give the impression of a natural rockface at the rear of the garden.

Notes:

Option two has a half width pergola with a larger lawn area. The pergola in both options will be uplit and also feature hidden downlighters. Water feature to be confirmed as will final location depending on what the client agrees. Existing walls are to be left untouched as they are brick built and having been recently pointed make great features for lighting/planting backdrops. The middle wall may feature a cantilevered section that will "float" above the decked area walkway.

Some of the plants: *Carex buchananii*, *Deschampsia oespitosa* 'Bronzeschieleer', *Deschampsia oespitosa* 'Goldtau', *Hakonechloa macra* 'Aureola', *Miscanthus sinensis* 'Gracillimus', *Pennisetum alopecuroides* 'Hamelii', *Stipa gigantea*, *Dierama pulcherrimum*, *Acanthus hungaricus*, *Betula utilis* var. *jacquemontii*, *Rosmarinus officinalis* var. *angustissimus* 'Benenden Blue', *Perovskia atriplicifolia*, *Campanula* 'Burghallii', *Campanula makaschvilii*, *Buxus sempervirens*, *Iris germanica* varieties.

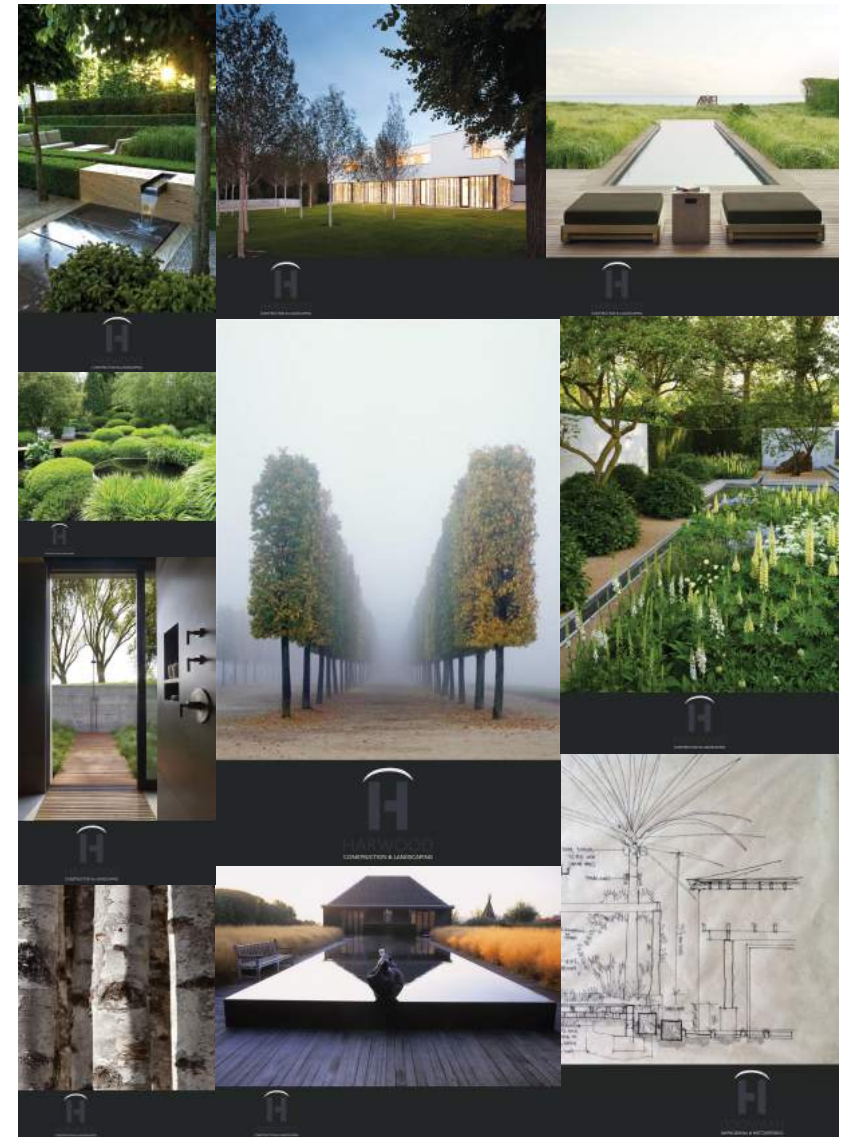

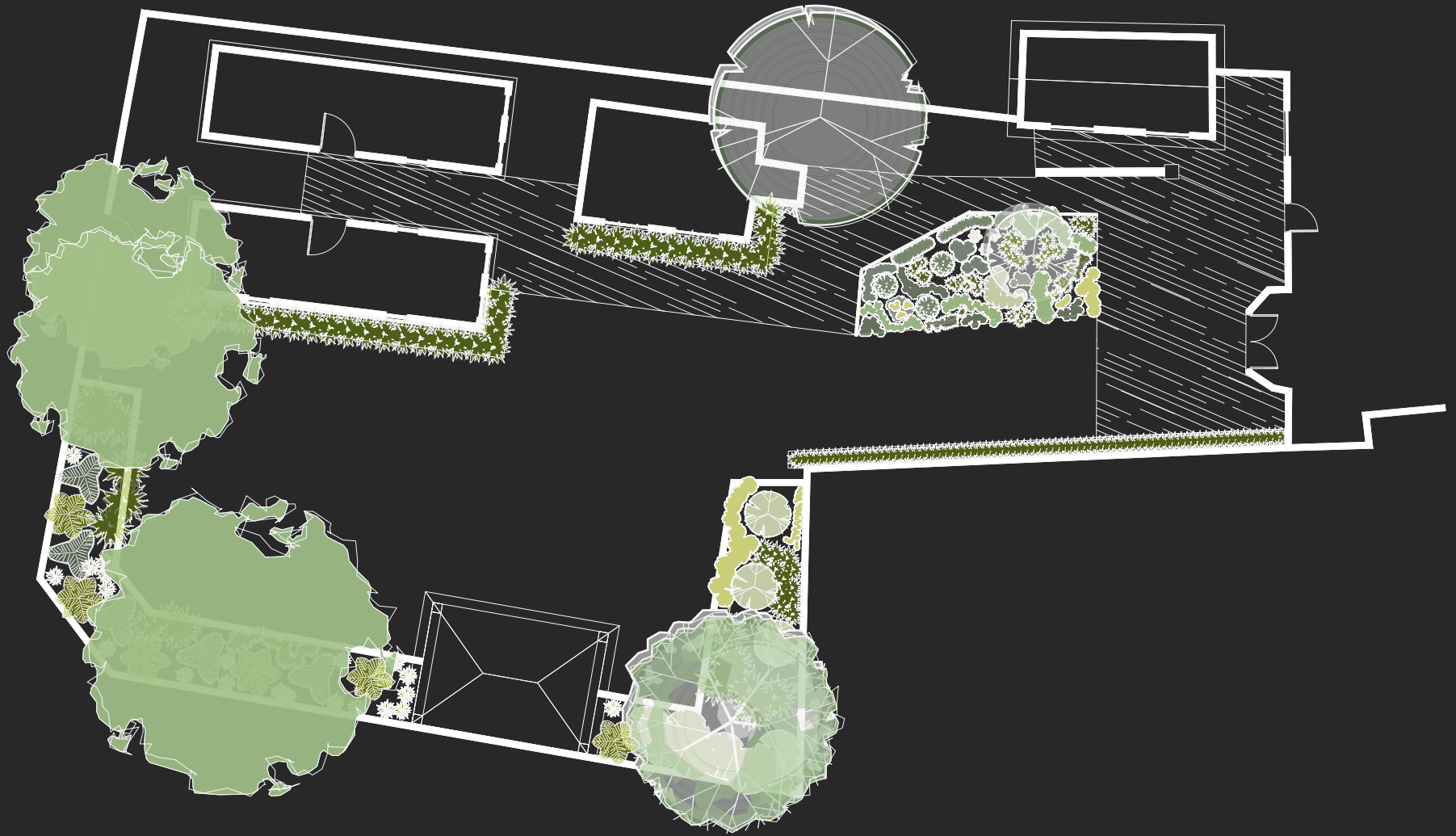
